INTRODUCTION

HISTORY OF M S INTERNATIONAL, INC.

Manu and Rika Shah founded MSI in 1975, in the basement of their home in Ft. Wayne, Indiana. MSI is now the largest importer and distributor in the world of Premium Surfaces including granite, marble, porcelain and ceramic tiles, slate, travertine, limestone and other natural stone products from 37 countries. Most notably, MSI provided the granite for the Vietnam Memorial in DC.

Manu and Rika Shah established Sarva Mangal Family Trust (Sarva Mangal means 'let all be happy' in Sanskrit) over 20 years ago with compassion as their driving force for philanthropy. Manu's vision for SMFT is to act as a catalyst, challenge status quo, nurture passionate change-makers and support leapfrogging ideas that are scalable and sustainable. Today, all members from the Shah family are involved in social impact initiatives that are undertaken by SMFT. Manu supports VOSAP — Voice of Specially Abled People, which has created over 10,000 change makers and rated over 18,000 buildings rated for accessibility. He also supports Lend a hand India, which provides digital vocational training to over 300,000 students in 20,000 schools.

In 2007, Mr. Manu Shah was named Ernst & Young's national Entrepreneur of the Year in the distribution, manufacturing, and security category.




About the SMFT Funded Project

Leveraging VOSAP Digital Tools, a network of trusted AT, NGO partners are key strategies to increase the project's impact.





On September 21, 2024, Voice of SAP (VOSAP), a nonprofit supported by the Sarva Mangal Family Trust (SMFT), hosted its annual gala in Artesia, California, raising over \$1,000,000 to empower Specially Abled People in India. The event drew prominent philanthropists, community leaders, and volunteers. During the gala, the Artesia City Council recognized VOSAP's mission with a Certificate of Recognition presented by Mayor Tony Lima and Pro Tem Mayor Ali Sajjad Taj.

VOSAP founder Pranav Desai showcased the organization's impact, having transformed the lives of over 27,000 Specially Abled People. He also presented VOSAP's Vision 2047, explaining how a \$100 donation could generate \$10,000 in economic growth, a message that resonated strongly with attendees.

A highlight of the evening was the HITARTH project, launched in May 2024, which strengthens the Government of India's NIRAMAYA program by providing social workers to help families of intellectually disabled individuals access healthcare services up to Rs 1 lakh.

Manu and Rika Shah, key supporters of VOSAP and founders of the Sarva Mangal Family Trust, pledged to match donations up to \$500,000, inspiring further generosity among attendees. The evening featured a musical performance by VOSAP youth ambassador Sparsh Shah, accompanied by volunteers Dr. Dhiren Buch and Priyanka Dujari, capping off a night of celebration and impact.

Voice of SAP is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with Special Consultative Status from the UN Economic and Social Council, working to empower Specially Abled People in India.

Nisha Kumari, from Gurugram, is an inspiring example of how technology can empower individuals to overcome significant challenges. Nisha and her husband, both hearing

impaired, had long dreamt of building their own home. Despite the absence of family support, they embarked on this life-changing journey with determination, relying on each other and their resolve to succeed.

One of the key tools in their success was the Signable App, a platform designed to facilitate communication between vendors and clients using sign language. For Nisha and her husband, the app proved to be a game-changer. Traditionally, managing the construction of a house involves constant communication with contractors, vendors, and suppliers. The couple initially faced daunting communication barriers due to their disability. However, through the Signable App, they could express their requirements, monitor progress, and negotiate terms seamlessly, all in their native sign language.

In a vibrant interaction using sign language, Nisha shared her immense gratitude for the app. "We don't worry about any communication barriers because we use this service, and we will continue to use it," she expressed with joy. For her, the app was not just a tool; it became a lifeline that empowered them to navigate complex challenges, removing the communication obstacles that once stood in their way.

Nisha and her husband's story is one of perseverance and self-confidence. They didn't allow their lack of familial support to deter them from their goal. Instead, they relied on each other and embraced modern technology to fulfill their dream of building a home in Gurugram. Nisha encouraged others in similar situations to believe in themselves and push forward, no matter the odds.

Their success is a testament to the power of technology, self-belief, and the importance of breaking down communication barriers. Today, Nisha and her husband are proud homeowners, and their journey serves as an inspiration to many others who face similar challenges.

Bhagirathi, born into a farming family in tribal Odisha, is one of three visually impaired siblings. Despite the significant challenges posed by his disability, his unwavering determination drove him to achieve a master's degree in arts. His relentless pursuit of education and personal growth set him apart in his community, but he aimed even higher—aspiring to pass the prestigious Orissa Public Service Commission (OPSC) exam.

A turning point in Bhagirathi's journey came when SMFT supported nonprofit Voice of Specially Abled People provided him with a Kibo XS Device. This advanced assistive tool allowed Bhagirathi to access essential educational resources, empowering him to engage with a world of information that had previously been inaccessible due to his visual impairment. The Kibo XS Device opened new possibilities, enabling Bhagirathi to prepare for the OPSC exam with confidence.

With the support of VOSAP and the life-changing assistive technology, Bhagirathi shattered the barriers that once held him back. After months of tireless effort and determination, he successfully passed the OPSC exam, realizing his dream of becoming an assistant collector. This achievement marked a significant milestone in his life, underscoring the transformative power of assistive technology and community support in unlocking the potential of individuals with disabilities.

Vinod Bhai, from Palanpur, faced immense challenges due to his locomotor disability. Mobility was a significant hurdle, making it difficult for him to pursue his goal of starting and managing a business. For years, Vinod struggled with limited opportunities, unsure of how to overcome the physical limitations that stood in his way.

Everything changed when Voice of Specially Abled People provided him with a tricycle. This simple yet life-changing assistive device transformed Vinod's daily life, giving him the mobility and independence he had long needed. With newfound freedom to move around easily, Vinod took the bold step of opening his own tire repair and puncture shop. Now, he earns between 3,000 and 4,000 INR per month, a source of both financial stability and pride.

Beyond just commuting to his workplace, the tricycle has given Vinod the confidence to dream bigger. He now plans to relocate his business to a more strategic location on the highway, where he hopes to focus on repairing truck tires. With this expansion, he aims not only to grow his own business but also to employ others, creating opportunities for more individuals in his community.

Vinod Bhai's journey is a testament to the power of assistive devices in unlocking new possibilities for people with disabilities. The tricycle provided by VOSAP didn't just give him mobility, it gave him the tools to build a future.
