Most notably, MSI provided the granite for the Vietnam Memorial in DC.

Manu and Rika Shah established Sarva Mangal Family Trust (Sarva Mangal means 'let all be happy' in Sanskrit) over 20 years ago with compassion as their driving force for philanthropy. Manu's vision for SMFT is to act as a catalyst, challenge status quo, nurture passionate change-makers and support leapfrogging ideas that are scalable and sustainable. Today, all members from the Shah family are involved in social impact initiatives that are undertaken by SMFT. Manu supports VOSAP — Voice of Specially Abled People, which has created over 10,000 change makers and rated over 18,000 buildings rated for accessibility. He also supports Lend a hand India, which provides digital vocational training to over 300,000 students in 20,000 schools.

In 2007, Mr. Manu Shah was named Ernst & Young's national Entrepreneur of the Year in the distribution, manufacturing, and security category.

SMFT DONATES ANIMAL AMBULANCE TO ALAI RESCUES IN BANGALORE

Sarva Mangal Family Trust has made a significant impact on animal welfare in Bangalore by donating a fully equipped animal ambulance to ALAI (Animal Lives Are Important) Rescues. This generous contribution greatly enhances ALAI's ability to respond to emergencies, ensuring that injured and distressed animals receive the prompt medical attention they desperately need. The new ambulance is outfitted with the latest equipment, providing a safe and efficient means of transport to veterinary facilities and enabling ALAI to extend their reach and effectiveness in rescuing and rehabilitating animals.

VISIT – AFRICA HEALTH MISSION

May 2024 – The SMFT-supported Africa Health Mission recently completed a remarkable journey across Ghana, Cameroon, and Nigeria. Over the course of 24 days, our team embarked on 9 flights, visiting 130 schools and screening over 70,000 individuals. This mission resulted in more than 15,000 people being referred for further optometric care, and 5,600+ eyeglasses distributed to those in need.

In Ghana, we collaborated with Watborg Eye Services, the Lions Club, Ghana Education Service, and Pharmanova. Our efforts in Accra focused on assessing vision in schools using portable autorefractors for both students and teachers. Through our specialized optometric services, we were able to address complex visual needs and distribute free eyeglasses to enhance vision. This initiative impacted over 18,000 students and teachers, with 4,000 individuals referred to optometrists and 1,500 eyeglasses provided to those with more complex needs.

In Cameroon, our collaboration with the West Regional Council of Cameroon took us to Bafoussam. Here, we screened the vision of more than 14,000 students and teachers, referred 1,000 people to optometrists, and provided 500 eyeglasses. Additionally, we conducted anemia screenings using the Masimo Rad-67, a noninvasive device for detecting anemia levels. Through this initiative, we screened over 600 students, identifying 36 cases of anemia and providing nutritional support guidance across 6 schools.

Our efforts in Nigeria, in collaboration with the Indo Eye Care Foundation and the Rotary Club, were centered in Lagos. We screened the vision of more than 37,000 students and teachers, referred 10,000 individuals to optometrists, and distributed 4,000 eyeglasses to those with complex visual needs. This significant outreach has greatly enhanced the vision health of many, contributing to better educational and personal outcomes.

The mission has made a substantial impact by providing essential eye care and raising awareness about vision health, significantly improved the quality of life for thousands.

VISIT – RESOLUTION PROJECT

May 2024 – The SMFT team recently had the privilege of meeting with beneficiaries of the Resolution Project, a partner organization dedicated to providing seed funding and lifelong support to promising young leaders in social entrepreneurship. This engagement included impactful meetings with founders of various ventures in Ghana and Nigeria, all striving to bring about significant social change.

In Accra, Ghana, the SMFT team met with Ms. Maame Efua Yamoawah Essel and Ms. Dorcas Babet Kwofie, cofounders of Impart Reading. Their initiative enhances literacy among rural children aged 7-15 by establishing mini libraries in rural schools and using mobile libraries for remote areas. They are also introducing audiobooks and technology to include children with disabilities, engaging over 20 volunteers to promote literacy and education.

In Lagos, Nigeria, Dr. Imodoye Abioro, co-founder of Lend an Arm, presented Nigeria's first digital blood bank and delivery system. Lend an Arm aims to save lives through timely access to safe blood transfusions, especially in emergencies, by connecting blood donors with patients and delivering blood within 30 minutes. They plan to scale nationwide with a focus on addressing sickle cell disease and are developing Asake, a cognitive virtual assistant, to improve services.

Additionally, the SMFT team met with representatives of the Safer Hands Initiative (SHI) in Lagos. SHI provides essential healthcare services and support to underserved communities, focusing on maternal and child health. They equip Traditional Birth Attendants (TBAs) with birthing kits, conduct educational programs, and raise community awareness. Operating in 27 communities, SHI has reached over 10,000 women and trained 218 birthing attendants.

The SMFT team met with Ms. Rahmah A. Aderinoye, cofounder of Rashak Agro, in Lagos. Rashak Agro supports smallholder farmers in North Africa by addressing challenges such as limited inputs and post-harvest losses. The initiative offers quality inputs, training, and fair trade practices, complemented by processing and warehousing facilities. Rashak Agro has benefited over 9,500 farmers, generated more than 110,000 jobs.

NGO VISIT – ALAI RESCUES

May 2024 – Recently, the SMFT team visited Animal Lives Are Important (ALAI) in Bangalore. During our visit, we witnessed firsthand ALAI's unwavering commitment to caring for 750 animals, including dogs, cows, ponies, ducks, and Guinea fowls. Supported by a dedicated team of 25 staff members, ALAI operates two shelters, each bustling with activity and a palpable sense of care.

ALAI's mission revolves around rescuing, rehabilitating, and rehoming vulnerable street animals. They operate specialized units such as Canine Distemper, Palliative, and Geriatric care, ensuring that each animal receives tailored attention suited to its needs. The impact of their work is visible in every corner of their facilities, where animals once in distress now thrive under their dedicated care.

An essential asset to ALAI's operations is the Animal Ambulance, generously donated by SMFT. This vehicle, equipped with a distinct siren, plays a crucial role in their rescue efforts by swiftly navigating through Bangalore's bustling streets, prompting cooperation from the community to clear the way during emergencies.

However, ALAI faces significant challenges. Providing adequate food for larger animals, securing their own land for expanded operations, acquiring sufficient cages, and managing monthly operational expenses for two shelters are ongoing hurdles. Despite these challenges, ALAI remains steadfast in their commitment to expanding their impact.

Looking ahead, ALAI is actively engaged in identifying locations for two additional animal shelter homes. Our support will enable them to donate two more ambulances, further enhancing their capacity to reach and rescue more animals in need across Bangalore.

Our visit to ALAI was not just eye-opening but deeply inspiring. It reaffirmed the profound impact of compassion and dedicated efforts in transforming the lives of vulnerable animals. ALAI's work is not just about rescue; it's about restoring dignity and hope to creatures who deserve our care and protection.

Siddh Divvang Foundation (SDF)


Education:

- Early Education: Imparting early education to Divyang (Specially Abled) children in rural India using Assistive Technology. This makes the learning process interactive by incorporating a gaming approach.
- Global Technology: Bringing impactful and affordable global technology to India for the lowincome segment of the Divyang society.



Health:

- Healthy Baby Initiative: Ensuring the birth of healthy babies (birth weight > 2.5 kg) to prevent high infant mortality and morbidity. See the graph below for the urgency of this initiative.
- Pre-Conception Care: Educating and monitoring eligible couples to reduce neonatal mortality, stillbirth
 rates, preterm deliveries, and low birth weight babies during the preconception, prenatal, and perinatal
 periods.
- Baby Care: Educating parents of newborns about developmental milestones from birth to 24 months
 in three-month intervals. Monitoring the developmental growth of babies for early diagnosis and
 potential corrective actions.



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About the SMFT Funded Project

Education:

- Project Knowledge Vision: This includes the Talking Map, which enables Divyang children, including the visually impaired, to interact directly with computer applications through an interface of RFID tags and a reader for learning and assessment.
- Talking Map: Designed for the visually impaired, this tool allows users to visualize state and district borders through touch and sound, helping them learn more about regions independently.



Health:

- **Projects Vatsalya and Healthy Baby:** These health projects are being implemented through a joint initiative by signing MoUs between:
 - 1. State Family Welfare Bureau (Government of Maharashtra)
 - 2. UNICEF, India
 - 3. KEM Hospital, Pune
 - 4. Siddh Divyang Foundation




- The Government of Maharashtra is the project owner responsible for implementing Project Vatsalya and Healthy Baby in all districts of Maharashtra. This will be done in a phased manner through their network of health workers, including Asha workers and Auxiliary Nursing Midwives (ANM) throughout the state.
- UNICEF, India is the project coordinator and responsible for providing domain-related content in Marathi for Project Vatsalya.
- KEM Hospital, Pune is responsible for providing medical domain-related multilingual content in Marathi,
 Hindi, and English for Project Healthy Baby.
- Siddh Divyang Foundation (SDF) is the Technology Partner for both projects. They are responsible for application development, including the development and integration of multilingual multimedia content for both projects. SDF also provides training material for implementation.

SDF is providing all these services at their own cost with generous support from SMFT. This is the first project of its kind in India, and SDF is proud to pioneer such an important initiative in the country with pivotal support from SMFT. In due course, they hope to implement these projects in other states of the country.




Project Geography



Recent Project Updates

Siddh Divyang Foundation is one of the few NGOs working in the health domain, both spreading awareness and collecting and monitoring data of eligible mothers and newborn babies. While spreading awareness is relatively easy, collecting accurate field data is extremely difficult. Therefore, it is essential to work with the government ecosystem, including Asha Workers and Auxiliary Nurse Midwife (ANM), who are in touch with eligible couples and mothers of newborn babies. Both of these applications will reach the ultimate beneficiaries, with the content explained to parents by health workers.



They plan to cover an estimated 5 million eligible couples for health services until conception. Out of these, about 2 million pregnant women will be monitored every year during pregnancy for antenatal care, nutrition, and health services. Additionally, about 1.8 million children will be monitored annually for various services such as growth monitoring, early childhood development, and immunization.

For Project Vatsalya, field trials for data collection in a phased manner started on June 1, 2024. Both projects are being adopted into the government budgetary system, ensuring the continuity of the initiatives

Overall Impact

Project: Knowledge Vision and Talking Map

Siddh Divyang Foundation implemented Project Knowledge Vision, including the Talking Map, in 5 states
of India: Maharashtra, Telangana, Gujarat, Bihar, and Uttarakhand. As of March 31, 2024, they have
positively impacted 18,750 lives. Their focus remains on Divyang schools in rural areas with lower
economic resources.

Project: Vatsalya and Healthy Baby

• Interactive mobile apps for Project Healthy Baby and Project Vatsalya are now available on the Google Play Store, downloaded at no cost by users. Through social media and these apps, they have impacted a total of 195,000 lives by March 31, 2024.

Highlight of the Month

During the first week of January 2024, at the International Purple Fest in Goa, an inclusive festival for companies in the Divyang space, Siddh Divyang Foundation connected with Tokyo-based Digireha. They collaborated on an interactive platform using 5 sensors (for hand, leg, eye, voice, and touch movements) to help autistic children interact with computer applications in a 3D environment, enhancing their communication skills.

Jagjeet Singh from Digireha's Delhi office provided a detailed demonstration at Siddh Divyang Foundation's Pune office to domain experts and Dr. Anand Pandit, an advisory board member. Field testing with a 20-year-old autistic individual yielded positive results, leading to ongoing discussions to finalize collaboration details.

Health Initiative: Prevention is Better than Cure

- With pivotal support from SMFT, Siddh Divyang Foundation (SDF) collaborated with KEM Hospital Pune
 to launch Project Healthy Baby. This initiative guides and monitors mothers of newborns on achieving
 developmental milestones during the baby's first 12 months, assessed at 3-month intervals. If milestones
 are not met, simulation exercises for corrective actions are recommended for home-based interventions.
- KEM Hospital's team of domain experts, with over 150 years of experience, provided domain-specific
 content, including multimedia materials in Marathi, Hindi, and English. Siddh Divyang Foundation's role
 involved developing a technology platform for disseminating information and collecting and compiling
 data, including the baby's developmental milestones, all funded by Siddh Divyang Foundation at their
 own cost.

Scaling Impact in Maharashtra and Beyond

 The technology-driven platform, Healthy Baby, developed by Siddh Divyang Foundation with pivotal support from SMFT, has enabled scaling to 5 million eligible couples annually in Maharashtra, offering health services till conception. This successful model holds promise for replication in other states, contributing to nationwide health improvements.

In January 2024, Siddh Divyang Foundation launched Project Knowledge Vision at Shubham Viklang Vikas Sansthan, a dedicated welfare society serving disabled, mentally retarded, and

underprivileged children. This initiative aimed to enhance educational opportunities through technology, providing Shubham with essential resources at no cost. Each school received laptops equipped with application software featuring 275 lessons and exercises in Marathi, Hindi, Gujarati, and English. Additionally, they received RFID tags and a portable speaker, enriching the learning experience for visually and hearing-impaired students.

The implementation of Knowledge Vision sparked immediate interest and enthusiasm among students and faculty alike. The feedback from Shubham has been overwhelmingly positive, highlighting the transformative impact of accessible technology in education. Students now engage more actively with interactive lessons tailored to their needs, fostering a supportive learning environment. Teachers commend the application's effectiveness in catering to diverse learning abilities, facilitating inclusive education practices.

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As my baby is 5 months old, I received useful information about the baby's growth through your Healthy Baby app. When my baby was 3 months old, I observed the baby did not have proper neck control.
